The Big Story WFO - 1155th – TOD REUNION

The AFTAC reunion of 1999 was planned and organized as a joint effort of the Technical Operations Division (TOD) and the WFO-1155th-TOD Reunion Committee. In the early spring of '98 the Reunion Committee was engaged in planning its fourth reunion activity for the Sacramento area when we learned of the planned inactivation of the outfit. The Committee quickly decided to work with TOD to hold the reunion in concert with the TOD inactivation ceremonies. This would give all the alumni a chance to participate in both activities thereby enhancing the experience for everyone. Our previous West Coast reunions were held in Sacramento in 1981, 1985, 1994. (these dates were taken from Florida records)

We were fortunate to have selected the Holiday Inn Northeast as the site of the reunion activities. The Holiday Inn had completed most of its major renovation work and was in pristine condition. (The entrance road was still a bit rocky, but no one minded).

In December '98, we mailed out a newsletter and registration forms to over 3,800 alumni with a requested response deadline of February 1st. By February 15th we had received less than 200 reservations and were beginning to worry about the 400-500 estimate we had given the Hotel for the banquet. Not to worry though, because by the evening of the banquet, we already had a standby waiting list due to having maxed out the number of seats (496) available.

We opened registrations for the reunion on Wednesday evening in the hotel lobby and **'F Troop'** used the Hospitality Suite for a mini-reunion. The first 'official' activity was the Golf Tournament at Lawrence Links on a rainy Thursday afternoon (see Cal Brown & Jim Esping's following article for details) followed Thursday evening with a wonderful cocktail party and buffet dinner which drew an unexpectedly large group of attendees. This provided an indication of what we were to expect for the banquet on Friday evening.

The Friday morning TOD Inactivation ceremonies in the Coast Guard Hangar at McClellan AFB were great. Col. Harold J. **Beatty**, AFTAC Commander, gave an inspiring and touching speech about the history and accomplishments of the WFO, 1155th Tech Ops and TOD units and the fantastic, talented people that were assigned to them over the years. TOD staff were impressive in formation for the ceremonies and had worked very hard to make sure the activity came off without a hitch, including the nice refreshments and transportation from the hotel.

Following the ceremonies, TOD provided bus transportation to an open house in the TOD Russell building. And 'open' doesn't begin to describe the experience. The TOD staff is to be commended for trying their best to provide something for everyone to see, but most of the equipment had already been boxed up awaiting shipment or had already left the building for another life somewhere else.

However, they gave a very interesting and informative slide presentation about the mission. The Russell building itself is a very nice facility and a giant leap from the old building 628 where a lot of us spent our time. Buses then took everyone back to the 'front' side of McClellan for a tour of the Aviation Museum and then back to the hotel.

The Friday evening Banquet Dinner and Dance tested the hotel facilities and staff to the limit. The banquet facilities will normally accommodate about 450 guests. We topped out at a few more than 500. Despite the somewhat crowded conditions, the hotel staff served a variety of fine foods efficiently.

The TOD staff presented a delightful program, including some rare and much appreciated video footage covering the history of the organization from its inception. The memories and insights provided by Lt. General (Ret.) **Clapper**, who was the AFTAC Commander in '84 and '85, were much appreciated. Following the TOD Commander, Colonel **Rhoads'** well-received closing comments, the John Skinner Big Band provided their excellent program of fine dance music.

Saturday was a day of leisure, reminiscing, touring Old Sacramento (via base vans provided by TOD'ers), and mini-reunions. Some of the 'original' WFO folks were talking it up in the Hospitality suite in one side room while Col. Franz (Herb) **Dettmer**, past Commander of Det 202, and a bunch of Det 202 folks (about 20 or more) were gathering in another side room of the Hospitality Suite.

Throughout the four days of festivities, which culminated with a delicious Sunday Brunch, the reminiscing and partying continued with little let-up in the Hospitality Suite. The Hospitality Subcommittee, particularly Lew **Milligan**, George **Thompson** (pictured) and Frank **Goodreau** did a magnificent job of keeping the suite properly supplied and the good times flowing from Wednesday evening all the way to Sunday noon.

And then it was over...these events were truly memorable, and sad at the same time. As we bid farewell to an important element of AFTAC, remembered its past and its mission, we did so with good friends and past partners in this critical work. Now we move forward in our own worlds and ways, knowing that AFTAC will be ever changed by this event, but will continue to be an important organization to our government and will continue to be graced with the 'best people on this earth.'
