

Come join us on a cruise on the Clear Lake Queen, Saturday, 10 August 2002. The Queen is a three-deck paddlewheeler that carries 150 passengers with dining accommodations for 96 and a bar on the second deck. Clear Lake is the largest natural lake in California, with 127 miles of shoreline. Believed to be the oldest (4 million years) lake in North America, the lake and surrounding area abounds in Indian folklore. The three-hour cruise offers ample time to view the lake and surrounding mountains. Mt Konocti, although dormant, is still listed as an active volcano and is clearly visible from the boat. All dining tables have a window view. The on-board chef promises a delicious luncheon. Many will remember the good time we had on this cruise in April 2000.

The cruise, including lunch, tax and tip costs \$30 per person. Make reservations by July 29th by contacting George Thompson 707-994-4143. Messages may be left on the answering machine. Cruise time: 11 am to 2 pm. Please be at the marina by 10:30 am. Location: Lucerne Harbor Park, 6225 E. Hwy 20, Lucerne CA. If you'd like to spend the night, there are quite a few motels, resorts, RV park and the Twin Pine Indian gaming casino close by. Konocti Harbor Resort (800-660-LAKE) has a headliner show on Friday, Aug 9th. Clear Lake is about 100 miles (2-hour drive) from Sacramento. Interstate 5 to Williams, then State Route 20 is the easiest, most direct route. But, for a scenic drive along Cache Creek, take Interstate 5 to Woodland, then State Routes 16 & 20.
