It is time to make your plans to attend the 2011 AFTAC Worldwide reunion which is being hosted by the AFTAC Alumni Association - West Coast Chapter. The site selection committee searched throughout the Sacramento region to find the "perfect" location for this event. For nostalgic and practical reasons the Lions Gate Hotel (formally the "O" Club at McClellan AFB) was selected. This facility offers registered guests complementary buffet breakfasts, will set up transportation to and from the Sacramento International Airport (\$14/person), and has rooms ranging from refurbished BOQ's to the SMAMA General's quarters (4 bedrooms). Prices for lodging range from \$89 - \$349/night with some quarters offering full kitchens and multiple bedrooms. The bar and restaurant facilities are revamped and very accommodating. Thursday, 12 May 2011: Early sign-in and hospitality suite activities. George Thompson, the maestro of the hospitality suite, has toured the facility for this function and gives it two thumbs up. SENSITIVE AFTAC COMPLEX MOVING AWAY FROM SR A1A

The Department of Defense will spend nearly \$200 million next year to build a new headquarters for the Patrick Air Force Base surveillance organization that tracks nuclear-weapon detonation and testing worldwide.

Construction of a new Air Force Technical Applications Center complex, which would include at least three buildings and a parking garage, is expected to begin in the spring, with completion targeted by the end of 2012, said Brig. Gen. Burke "Ed" Wilson, the commander of the 45th Space Wing at Patrick.

Wilson, who in February assumed command at the base, announced the project during an interview Thursday with FLORIDA TODAY at Cape Canaveral Air Force Station.

"It's actually the largest construction project in the United States for the Air Force," Wilson said. "It's a \$150 million-plus project. So that will be very, very visible. Because that big building you see on A1A, we'll begin to depopulate that, and you'll see another building going up just across the street."

Today, AFTAC is headquartered in a four-story building along the west side of State Road A1A and across from the base's Tides Club. About 940 military and civilian personnel work or are assigned to the national security surveillance unit.

So important is AFTAC's headquarters to national security that the military shut down SR A1A immediately after the terrorist attacks of Sept. 11, 2001. Later, traffic along the bustling beachside roadway was restricted to just two lanes, and a barrier was built to shield the building. The front of the structure was also reinforced with steel and concrete. In the months before SR A1A reopened to normal traffic flow, no heavy trucks or trailers were allowed in front of the base.

The new command and control headquarters will be built farther west on base property, away from the busy public road. "You'll begin to see that through the summer and into the fall of next year in 2011," Wilson said.

Wilson said the AFTAC complex and other significant construction projects already under way -- such as on-base road repairs and an \$18.5 million, 74,000-square-foot medical clinic that broke ground in August -- are indications that Patrick's future is secure.

While there are sometimes questions about whether the base is safe from federal budget cuts or military downsizing, Wilson said there are no indications at Air Force headquarters or locally that there would be any such cuts.

"With things like our Technical Application Center, with the 920th Rescue Wing, we have some fairly unique assets there at Patrick that (U.S. military forces) rely on," Wilson said.

The commander said the public will begin seeing evidence soon of construction starting, including cranes, trucks and heavy equipment movement along A1A. Further details, such as about the potential for new jobs to be created, were not immediately available. Past projects at the base often involved local subcontractors.

"This is a big, big project," Wilson said. "We're real excited about it. It's good to see it moving and get on contract. It's a new and exciting headquarters building for the AFTAC."
