It is time to make your plans to attend the 2011 AFTAC Worldwide reunion which is being hosted by the AFTAC Alumni Association - West Coast Chapter. The site selection committee searched throughout the Sacramento region to find the "perfect" location for this event. For nostalgic and practical reasons the Lions Gate Hotel (formerly the "O" Club at McClellan AFB) was selected. This facility offers registered guests complementary buffet breakfasts, will set up transportation to and from the Sacramento International Airport (\$14/person), and has rooms ranging from refurbished BOQ's to the SMAMA General's quarters (4 bedrooms). Prices for lodging range from \$89 - \$349/night with some quarters offering full kitchens and multiple bedrooms. The bar and restaurant facilities are revamped and very accommodating. 

From 1985 to his death in 1990, Dr. Peter attended and was involved in management of the <u>Kinetic Sculpture Race</u> in Humboldt County, California. He proposed an award for the race, titled "The Golden Dinosaur Award" which has been handed out every year since to the first sculptural machine to utterly break down immediately after the start. (Editor's note: I had the pleasure of attending a parade of vehicles which competed in that race. The parade was held in Ferndale, California, where the TDY teams from TOD stayed while supporting the portable "O" system during the 1970s.
