It is time to make reservations for the 2017 AFTAC worldwide reunion that is being hosted by the West Coast Chapter of the AFTAC Alumni Association. This will be the last reunion held by this chapter so let's go out with a whoop and a bang!

The reunion will be again held at the Lions Gate Hotel (formerly the "O" Club) at McClellan Park in Sacramento. Those attending six years ago will recall this as a perfect and nostalgic site for our reunion.

The General's Quarters will serve as the focus for reunion activities. It is a four bedroom home with multiple areas for large and small conversations. The patio and lawn areas are expansive and well shaded. The hospitality suite will be located there as well as serving as the venue for the Friday night social and the Saturday banquet.

- Thursday, 15 June, 2017: Early sign-in and the hospitality suite activates at the General's Quarters.
- Friday, 16 June, 2017: Sign-in continues at the hospitality suite. Starting at 1700 there will be a no host reception on the patio at the General's house. Hot and cold hors d'oeuvres will be offered. **Casual dress is the preferred attire the entire weekend.** Men can forget the suit jackets and women can forget the heels and cocktail dresses.

FIVE MEN AGREE TO STAND DIRECTLY UNDER EXPLODING

NUCLEAR BOMB

On July 19, 1957, five Air Force officers and one photographer stood together on a patch of ground about 65 miles northwest of Las Vegas. They'd marked the spot "Ground Zero. Population 5" on a hand-lettered sign hammered into the soft ground right next to them



The country was just beginning to worry about nuclear fallout,

Directly overhead, two F-89 jets roar into view, and one of them shoots off a nuclear missile carrying an atomic warhead.

They wait. There is a countdown; 18,500 feet above them, the missile is detonated and blows up. Which means, these men intentionally stood directly underneath an exploding 2-kiloton nuclear bomb. One of them, at the key moment (he's wearing sunglasses), looks up.

Who are these guys? Col. Sidney Bruce, Lt. Col. Frank P. Ball, Maj. Norman "Bodie" Bodinger, Maj. John Hughes, Don Lutrel, and George Yoshitake (the cameraman, not seen). And why is the narrator joyously shouting, "It happened! The mounds are vibrating. It is tremendous! Directly above our heads! Aaah!"

This footage comes from our government's archives. It was shot by the U.S. Air Force (at the behest of Col. Arthur B. "Barney" Oldfield, public information officer for the Continental Air Defense Command in Colorado Springs) to demonstrate the relative safety of a low-grade nuclear exchange in the atmosphere. Two colonels, two majors and a fifth officer agreed to stand right below the blast. Only the cameraman, George Yoshitake, didn't volunteer.

It just goes to show you what an extra drink at the officer's club can do to otherwise sane airmen!

WING EARNS OUTSTANDING UNIT AWARD

Air Combat Command recently announced the 55th Wing as a recipient of the Air Force Outstanding Unit Award for the time period of June 1, 2015 - May 31, 2016.

The OUA is awarded to units for exceptionally meritorious service, accomplishes specific acts of outstanding achievement, excels in combat operations against an armed enemy of the United States, or conducts with distinct military operations involving conflict with, or exposure to, a hostile action by any opposing foreign force.

"This award is a direct reflection on everyone in the Fightin' Fifty-Fifth," said Col. Mary Reynolds, 55th Wing commander. "Through their hard work and dedication, we were able to accomplish our mission, support our people and take pride in our support to combatant commanders around the world."

During this time, the wing surpassed 25 continuous years of operating in the U.S. Central Command's area of responsibility and supported every major Department of Defense mission around the world.

Overall, all seven of the 55th Wing's aircraft variants answered its nation's call when needed over this twelve month stretch.

- . RC-135V/W Rivet Joint crews flew 489 missions in support of six combatant commanders
- . EC-130H Compass Crews flew 522 missions in two AORs
- . RC-135S Cobra Ball crews executed 95 missions for four combatant commanders
- . RC-135U Combat Sent crews flew 112 high-priority missions
- . WC-135W Constant Phoenix crews generated 14 high-interest missions
- . OC-135B Open Skies crews conducted eight missions over Russia, Ukraine and Italy
- . E-4B crews surpassed 40 years of continuously alert

In addition to operations, the 55th Communications Group ensured the unit became the largest wing to ever pass a Command Cyber Readiness Inspection while the 55th Dental Squadron and 55th Force Support Squadron were named best in ACC.

"I'm continuously blown away by what our Airmen are doing on a daily basis here at the 55th Wing," said Chief Master Sgt. Michael Morris, 55th Wing command chief. "It's an honor to serve alongside them and this award is certainly deserved."

Anyone who served in the 55th Wing during this time period can now wear OUA ribbon and their records should be updated to reflect the award.


