William John Auth answered the Last Roll Call from his home in Citrus Heights on 3 March 2007. An unforgettable and proud Grandpa of Jessica and Jeffrey Proulx, Christine and Patrick Kerns, Kelsey and Logan Taylor. Honorary Grandpa for Megan and Robert T. Carter. Loving companion of eleven years and favorite bridge partner of Dorothy Young. Bill was born 15 August 1923 in Cleveland, Ohio, the son of Leo and Helen Auth. He was a four year honor student at Cathedral Latin, Silver Jubilee Class of 1941. He interrupted college to join the Army Air Corps as a pilot cadet in February 1943. Bill earned his pilot wings and appointment as 2nd Lt. on 8 February 1944. As a B-17 pilot with the 8th AF, 91st Bomb Group (H), 324th Bomb Sq., he flew 22 combat missions from Bassingbourn, England.

His final mission, 25 April 1945, was over Pilsen, Czechoslovakia, pilot of the low squadron lead plane - No. 588. His "unbiased view of what was happening" provided research material to the author of "The Forgotten Final Mission" by L. Getz, Aviation History, Jan. 2003. Bill graduated from Case Institute of Technology, BS Chemical Engineering with Honors in 1948. Membership in Tau Beta Pi, Alpha Chi Sigma and The Society of The Sigma Xi. He earned a Master of Science in Nuclear Chemistry from The Ohio State University in 1953. Member Phi Lambda Upsilon. An AF Regular Officer and Command Pilot, he was Deputy Chief, MCL, 1155th Tech Ops Sq., McClellan AFB at the time of his retirement in 1968. Bill was an avid golfer, getting a Hole in One in 1972, still playing with golf buddies until recently. He was a Bronze Master with the American Contract Bridge League, active community volunteer, famous for hand-tied fishing flies, ham and bean soup, and smoked salmon pate. He loved Jazz and Big Band music, leaving us while listening to Glenn Miller. His "favorite place" was in Alaska, fishing with Bill, Jr., a summer trip together all but one of the last 15 years. Bill, Daddy, Dad, Pops, Grandpa, Grampers, will always be remembered by those who loved him, but not missed by fish anywhere. Cremation service by Simple Traditions. AFTAC 60th ANNIVERSARY (1947 – 2007) ALUMNI WORLDWIDE REUNION, 7 – 11 JUNE 2007

- Yes, it's time once again; time to get together with old friends, make new friends, and see what everyone has been up to in recent times. Sound familiar? As you know, we've been holding a worldwide reunion every two years, alternating from Florida to California to Colorado. Having held highly successful reunions in Florida in 2003 and again in California in 2005, it's now time to come to Colorado in 2007 and we are ready to start taking reservations. Included with this issue of the newsletter is this overview, hotel information, and registration form. This information can also be found on the Florida, California, and Colorado websites.
- What we need from you: mark your calendars now for 7 11 June 2007, register early by completing the registration form and returning it along with your check, reserve your hotel room by calling the Doubletree Hotel Denver, and please pass the word along to other alumni who might not be members of one of the alumni chapters. Chapter membership is not required to attend the reunion. Early registration will allow better planning by the reunion committee and some planned activities are tentative depending on the responses we get on the registration forms. If you have any questions, please contact one of the committee members listed at the bottom of this page & the registration form.
- <u>Hospitality:</u> We will have a hospitality room in the Doubletree Hotel open daily beginning Thursday evening, 7 June. This is where you sign in and pick up your welcome package. Information will be available in the hotel lobby as to its location. Name tags will be provided in this package so please list names on the registration form as you want them to appear on the name tags.
- **Golf Outing**, Thursday afternoon, 7 June: This is a tentative item depending on the number of people signing up for it. HOTEL INFORMATION

AFTAC 60th ANNIVERSARY (1947 - 2007) ALUMNI WORLDWIDE REUNION, 7 – 11 JUNE 2007 DENVER, COLORADO

The reunion is being held at the <u>Doubletree Hotel Denver</u>, 3203 Quebec St., Denver, CO 80207. The 2001 Alumni Worldwide Reunion was held at this same hotel. The hotel toll free phone number is **800-559-5168** and the local number is **303-321-3333**.

ROOM RATES. A special room rate of **\$88.43** (includes all applicable taxes) is available for this reunion. This rate is also offered, based on availability, to attendees for three days before and three days after the above reunion dates. The hotel rooms have either two double beds or one king size bed. This special room rate is for single, double, triple, or quad occupancy.

<u>RESERVATIONS.</u> Reservations must be confirmed by **15 May 2007** for this special AFTAC reunion rate. The special rate may not be available after 15 May. When contacting the hotel to make your reservations you must tell them that you are participating in the June **2007 AFTAC Reunion to get the special room rate.** If you cancel your reservations with the hotel, please also notify Bill Schmied at bilschmied@aol.com or telephone 303-367-0625 so we can update our records for contract monitoring.

<u>CHECK-IN is 3:00 PM.</u> If you arrive before 3:00 PM, an early check-in is possible as rooms become available. The hotel has a secure room to safeguard your luggage if you arrive before the 3:00 PM check-in time.

<u>CHECK-OUT is 12:00 PM (NOON).</u> Please note that the hotel will add an early departure fee to your account should you depart prior to your reserved checkout date. To avoid an early checkout fee, you should advise the hotel at or before check-in of any change in your planned length of stay. The hotel will also inform you of this potential charge upon check-in.

AIRPORT SHUTTLE SERVICE. The hotel provides daily shuttle service to and from Denver International Airport (DIA) seven days a week from 4:30 AM (0430) to 12:30 AM (0030) rotating 15 and 45 minutes after the hour. At DIA, the hotel shuttle only picks up on the East Terminal from Doors 508 and 511 at Island #3 at the hotel pick-up signs. From DIA, you can call the hotel at their local number 303-321-3333 (all ten digits are required from local telephones) for current shuttle information.

<u>LOCAL SHUTTLE SERVICE.</u> The hotel also provides free limited local shuttle service. Additional information on this service is available at the hotel. Additionally, a casino bus is available daily in the hotel parking lot to provide transportation to the Blackhawk and Central City gambling casinos. A fee of \$18.00 per person is required for a round trip ticket for this service, but this fee will be refunded by some casinos when playing on their casino cards and attaining specified card points.

RENTAL CARS. There is an Avis rental car booth in the hotel lobby and cars are available at the hotel. You may get a better rate by contacting Carol or Marie at the hotel lobby booth at 303-393-0620. The best time to call is before noon Mountain time; however, should your call be routed to a central reservation point, ask to be transferred to the Doubletree Hotel Denver booth and tell them you are participating in the June 2007 AFTAC Reunion.
