The time is drawing nigh for this *World Wide Reunion, 2009, the registration deadline is April 17th and the earlier everyone registers the better. There, within the first few lines, you will find a link to a 'Sampler' of the Assn's newsletter, 'Post-Monitor;' the registration form is on page 5. **FORM ALSO ON PAGE 6 OF THIS NEWSLETTER**

Importantly, the following clarification/update pertains to the registration form and the reunion:

FIRST the clarification: There have been questions about the registration fee of \$15 per person if only attending the 'Ice Breaker' on Friday, 1 May, and/or the 'Pay There' events (Picnic, 2 May - Breakfast, 3 May) and the 'Open House.'

The board has listened and responded ... if one only wants to attend the 'Ice Breaker,' the reduced registration fee is only \$5.00 per person. This will cover administrative costs associated with attendance at that event (registering, name tags, etc) -- not programs and other material that will be handed out to those paying the \$15 fee.

There was never any intent to charge a registration fee for the 'Pay There' events or the 'Open House' but we do need names and a head count for these events.

SECONDLY the update: General (Retired) Clapper has agreed to be our 'Keynote' speaker, and preside over several special activities at the reunion banquet. General Clapper knows the command and the alumni association in a unique way. He was AFTAC Commander from June, 1984 to May 1985. He initiated major changes to the command and it was one of his famous 'handwritten notes' that first proposed the 'Alumni Association' as it is today!

We hope this reduction in price and clarification for several of the events will make the reunion even more attractive and increase attendance.

LUCAS, James "Jim", MSgt, USAF, Retired. Born 7 Nov 1926, passed away 24 Jan 2009 at age 82 in Minerva, Ohio.

Jim had been having heart problems for some time and in late September 2008 suffered a stroke and fell while walking. His daughter, Sabra Lucas, arrived on 01 Oct 2008 and Jim decided to sell his home in North Highlands and move to Ohio to be with her. The home sold very quickly and on 09 Nov 2008 they drove back to Ohio. On 24 Jan 2009, Jim had a massive coronary and passed away.

Jim worked for many years at the 1155th Tech Ops Squadron, McClellan Central Laboratory (MCL) before his retirement in August 1978. He was preceded in death by his wife, Annie. He was interred 02 Feb 2009 at Mt. Vernon Memorial Park, Fair Oaks, CA. Expressions of sympathy may be sent to Sabra Lucas, 501 N. Market St., Minerva, OH 44657. Jim was our reunion Treasurer and a vital part of most of our reunion planning committees for past AFTAC Reunions in Sacramento. Jim was also a member of the California State Old Time Fiddlers Association and enjoyed the monthly jam sessions at the Orangevale Grange Hall.

ARMINTROUT, Willard C. LtCol, USAF, Retired. Born in Piketon, Ohio on June 12, 1931 and passed away peacefully at home October 1, 2008. He will be greatly missed by his family & friends. He is survived by his wife, of 55 years, Peggy; 2 sons, Will Jr. (Betty) of Folsom, CA, Jeff of Florida & daughter Kristi (Steve) of Valley Springs, CA; 6 grand children & 5 great grand children; sister, Janie & 3 nieces of Ohio. Friends are welcome for visitation on Mon., October 6th from 4-7pm, and funeral services on Tues, October 7th at 11am at LIND BROTHERS MORTUARY, and burial will be at the National Cemetery in Dixon, CA. ALLISON, Jack G, LtCol, USAF, Retired, AFTAC Alumni West Coast Chapter President. Born in Coburg, Oregon, on November 21, 1924 and passed away on 24 Jan 2009, at age 84. Jack was one of five boys born to Raymond & Ruth Allison. Their family eventually moved to McMinnville, Oregon where with his father and older brother did the surveying to lay out an airfield which remains today and is used as an Air Museum with the Spruce Goose and other significant aircraft on display. At the start of WWII, after just one semester at Oregon State, Corvallis, Jack was drafted into the infantry. He completed his basic training and then decided to change course and go into aviation. His vision precluded him from becoming a pilot, so he trained as a B-29 bombardier, sitting in a glass bubble in the nose of the plane. His first tour of duty was on Tinian Island in the Pacific flying missions over Japan. While there he became aware of a special top secret project on the opposite side of the island which turned out to be the airfield from which the Enola Gay launched to drop the atomic bomb on Japan. As the war wound down, Jack's group dropped food supplies to US prisoners of war held in Japan which helped extend the lives of many of our soldiers.

After the war Jack returned to college where he met Rosalie and they were married just four days after graduating from Oregon State. Jack was called back into the Air Force and assigned to the ROTC program at Oregon State, his alma mater. After Squadron Officers School, he was immediately reassigned to Japan. Rosalie & daughters Kim and Kendree followed him to Japan a couple months later. They were next assigned to Hawaii where son, Brian was born.

Jack's next assignment was to 1035th Field Activities Group Headquarters in Washington DC in the early 60s; then on to Detachment 057, Lowry AFB Colorado. While there, Major Allison made frequent trips to Lackland AFB TX to interview and select basic trainees for Lowry's Special Electronic Equipment Technician School. Jack's next assignment was to Vietnam for a year. There he was exposed to Agent Orange, an exposure that would be ultimately fatal. After Vietnam,

Jack was assigned to the 1155th Technical Operations Squadron, McClellan AFB California, where he served as Personnel Officer until he retired on 1 Jun 1974.

Retirement and just sitting around was not appealing to Jack. While working for the United Farm Agency and the Nolan Real Estate Agency, he read an article about a new technology being developed in Davis CA. The article sparked his interest and lead him to Moller International to help work on a personal size "flying car". The **Moller Skycar** is a prototype personal VTOL (vertical take-off and landing) aircraft, called a "volantor" by its inventor Dr Paul Moller who has been developing such vehicles for many years. The design incorporates four ducted fans - the propellers being covered, which is safer and more efficient at low speeds. The sky uses eight inexpensive Wankel rotary engines instead of jet engines, which should eventually bring the vehicle's price close to that of a luxury car. The Skycar demonstrated limited tethered flight capability in 2003. More information and pictures of this remarkable vehicle can be found on the internet.

In addition to being the current WCC President, Jack was chairman of our Board of Directors, 1999-2001, and a vital part of our past AFTAC worldwide reunions. He was a co-chairman for the very first AFTAC reunion held in Sacramento in Jun 1983 as well as the last one held here in May 2005.

Jack was interred in the Sacramento Valley National Cemetery in Dixon, CA on March 20. Along with many family members, friends and co-workers, about 20 AFTAC alumni attended the memorial service with an Air Force color guard providing full military honors. A reception and tour of Moller International in Davis CA followed the memorial service.

MULLINAX, Billy R. SMSgt, USAF Retired. Born on June 27, 1931 in Gadsden, AL and left us on January 27, 2009 in Sacramento, CA at age 77. A US Air Force veteran who proudly served his country for 29 years' Bill loved football and coached at many levels, from Pop Warner to semi-professional. Bill was also an avid golfer who enjoyed playing a round or two with his friends when his health allowed. He is survived by his loving wife of 54 years, Jane Mullinax, and his three sons, David, Richard, and William. Bill is also survived by his three beautiful grandchildren who always made him smile, Kayla, Alex, and Tracy. The family will be holding a private service. **Editor's Note: Bill was a long time member of the 1155th/Tech Ops Logistics directorate, as a Seismic Maintenance Supervisor and as a charter member of the Quality Assurance "Sweathogs".**

BAUMAN, Vincent A. LtCol, USAF, Retired. It is with sad regret that I announce the passing of my father, Lt Col (Ret) Vincent A. Bauman, on 28 December 28, 2008, at the age of 91. Dad was a very proud member of AFTAC and the Alumni Association, and spoke often of his membership and contributions to the mission of AFTAC. Vincent was drafted in early 1941 and served as an infantry officer in the Army, earning two bronze stars and a purple heart for his action in Europe in WWII. After the war, he was discharged, but joined the Air National Guard in St. Louis. His unit was recalled for the Korean conflict, and he decided to stay on active duty for a full career. He proudly wore his Combat Infantry Badge on his Air Force uniform even before it was authorized for wear. If my memory is correct, he served in AFTAC from about 1956 through 1962, and those were some of his proudest moments of service in the Air Force. He took great pride in saying that one of the projects upon which he worked remains classified even today. He retired from the Air Force in 1967 after 22 years of active duty. He was buried in his uniform with full military honors. On behalf of Dad, thanks to everyone who knew him and who contributed to this critical role of AFTAC in the defense of our great Nation. Dan Fadness Email: 7 Jan 2009. Was I in Adak at the time of the Good Friday earthquake? No ...but almost! I was on my way towards separation at McChord and spent two days at Elmendorf AFB turning in some equip and processing out. I flew out Thursday afternoon and the earthquake occurred the next afternoon, as I recall...about 1700 .Smaller earthquakes were quite common on Adak but we never had anything like the Good Friday number.

Was Sgt Gomes attached to Det 2xx or assigned to another outfit? I don't remember him, but we were just starting to get replacements, as the 15 months assignment were up for some of us. He could have been my replacement or one of two others who left about the same time. Also we worked two man shifts and if he was assigned to someone else there would have been less of a chance of seeing him. If he was assigned to Det 2xx, does he remember the white blue eyed husky named Kiska? I found him as a pup out in never-never land close to Zeto Point. I was out there hunting seals. His parents were wild ones that ran loose and scavenged the beaches for a living. I brought him in, raised him and he became a detachment mascot. He was a pretty dog and everybody's pal. When I transferred out, our supply sergeant took him and said he would care for him.

Det 2xx was out by itself and our antenna systems drove the Navy troops crazy. Several wanted to know what the "H" we were doing, but of course, they never found out .We were instructed to do our jobs, keep our mouths shut....you know the story.

Well, I had better quit before I write a book. I don't suppose Adak will ever replace Honolulu as a vacation place but I enjoyed it while I was there. I remember the day Kennedy got shot and that was kind of a rude awakening. Everything and everybody was on full alert .When it was time to leave my fiancée made a better offer than the reenlistment officer. We got married about 2 weeks after I got home and 44 years later we're still together.

I do remember several things happening on Adak that could probably qualify as "peacetime war stories". One of the navy ensigns bringing in WW2 unexploded ordinance to be defused so he could keep it as a souvenir. It came in a pickup truck and the guys in ordinance almost filled their shorts on that one. Another time there was a dead whale washed up on the beach close enough to the base so that there was quite a smell. The Navy pulled it offshore with a fleet tug and shot the carcass all to pieces with a 3inch 50 thinking it would sink. Well, all the pieces washed back ashore and "it was a bad day at black rock" There's more but I don't want to be accused of being a motor mouth. Thanks again for your email and info. I'll get a check in the mail and see what happens. Dan Fadness


